Bible Name Dictionary

Bible Name: Baal-Herman Language: Hebrew Pronunciation: bah'-al kher-mone'

Meaning: The name 'Baal-Herman' means 'Possessor of Herman.' It is derived from two Hebrew root words. The first is 'Baal' meaning 'to marry', 'to possess', 'to own', 'to rule over' or 'to have dominion.' The second root word is 'Charam' meaning 'to devote', 'to dedicate', 'to consecrate' or 'to make sacred.'

Alternative meanings include: 'The Lord of Herman' or 'Baal of Herman.'

Please note: The word 'Baal' generally has reference to the following descriptive meanings: 'husband', 'lord', 'master' or 'owner.' It was also used by the Canaanites as a substitute title for their god, Hadad.

On another note... the word 'Charam' depicts a sacred object as something wholly dedicated unto the Lord. Furthermore, it is forbidden for anyone to touch said object for ordinary use. To do so would generally result in a destructive curse that would suddenly come upon the guilty party.

*** Apparently... Mt. Hermon was looked upon as a sacred mountain dedicated unto Baal. ***
